

SECTION C PHILOSOPHY

The educational system of Sioux Valley belongs to the community, not to the faculty, the administration or the board of education. It is the responsibility of these three groups to serve the community to the best of their combined abilities.

Education is learning to live. It should involve the entire being and should promote the physical, mental, and social welfare of the pupil. School personnel should realize that all pupils are not equally capable but that every child should be given a chance to develop to the extent to which he/she is capable.

The most important single factor in the learning process is the teacher. The personality, skills, and ability of the classroom teacher are vital to effective education.

If education consists in learning to live, then the subject matter and activities of the school curriculum should meet present day needs. Schools should develop in the students "the desire to learn."

1. To develop an individual who will help create a better world.
2. To create an atmosphere of education.
3. To provide materials and personnel to realize personal growth of all students.
4. To develop skills, habits, and attitudes that will lead to worthy use of leisure time.
5. To provide academic opportunities and vocational knowledge and skills for all students.
6. To prepare the individual to inquire, to evaluate, to understand and to enjoy life.
7. To provide the opportunities for the development of physical, mental, moral, and spiritual health.
